

## ***New: Condor to Cape Town***

### ***Two weekly flights to South Africa from November***

Frankfurt, June 28, 2012 – The German leisure carrier Condor is adding another dream destination, Cape Town in South Africa, to its winter 2012/13 flight program. Nonstop flights from Frankfurt am Main will be available from November 3, on Tuesdays and Saturdays, with return flights on Wednesdays and Sundays. Bookings can now be made for the Boeing 767-300 flights. Among other new destinations being introduced into Condor's winter 2012/13 flight plan are Rio de Janeiro in Brazil, Rangun in Myanmar, Siem Reap in Cambodia and the Cape Verde islands of Sal and Boa Vista.

Also to be enjoyed along the Atlantic coast are wide, sandy beaches that are ideal for bathing, surfing or riding on horseback, Chapman's Peak Drive, with its unique coastal panorama, and of course, the legendary Cape of Good Hope. Many visitors to South Africa are also held spellbound by the fascinating variety of flora and fauna.
